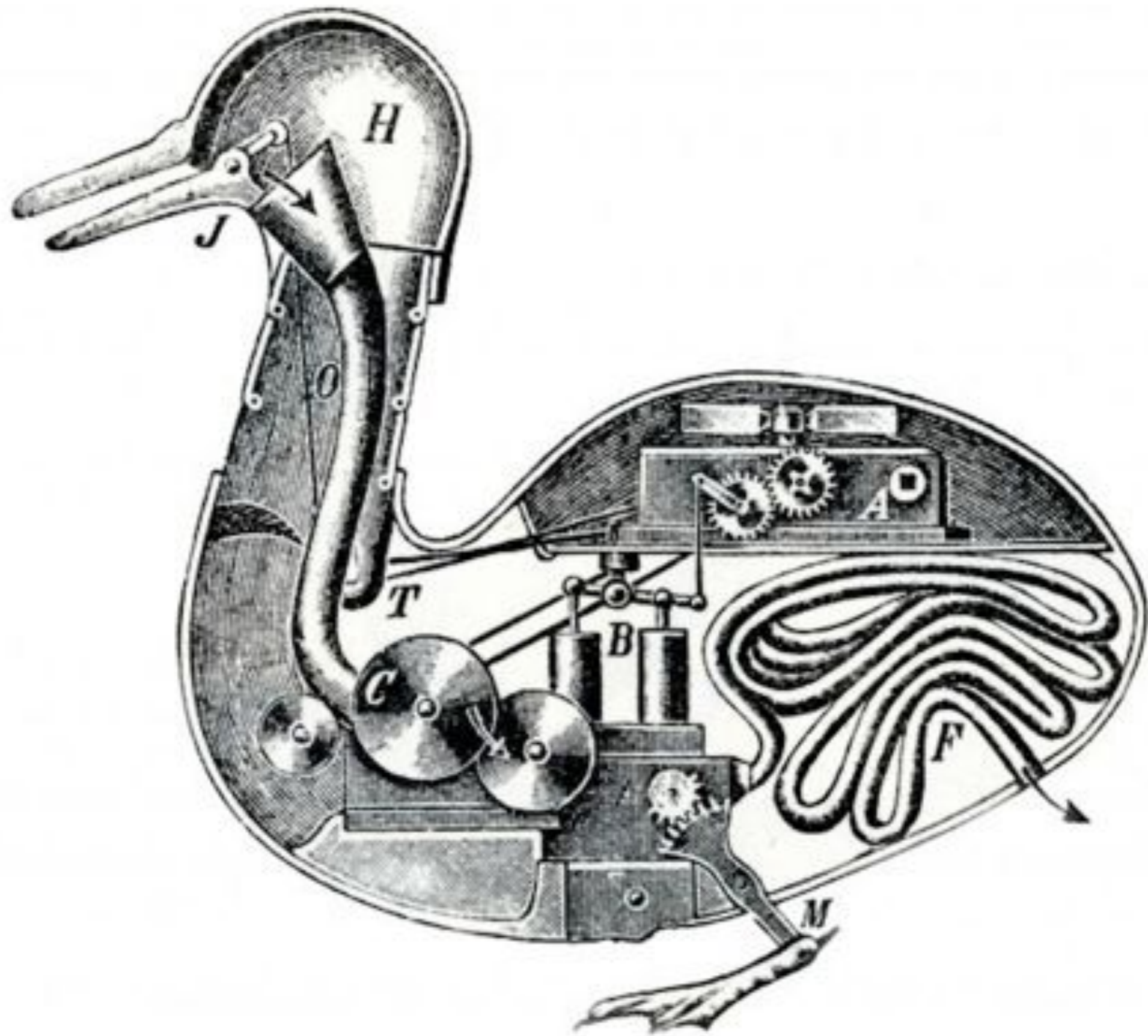

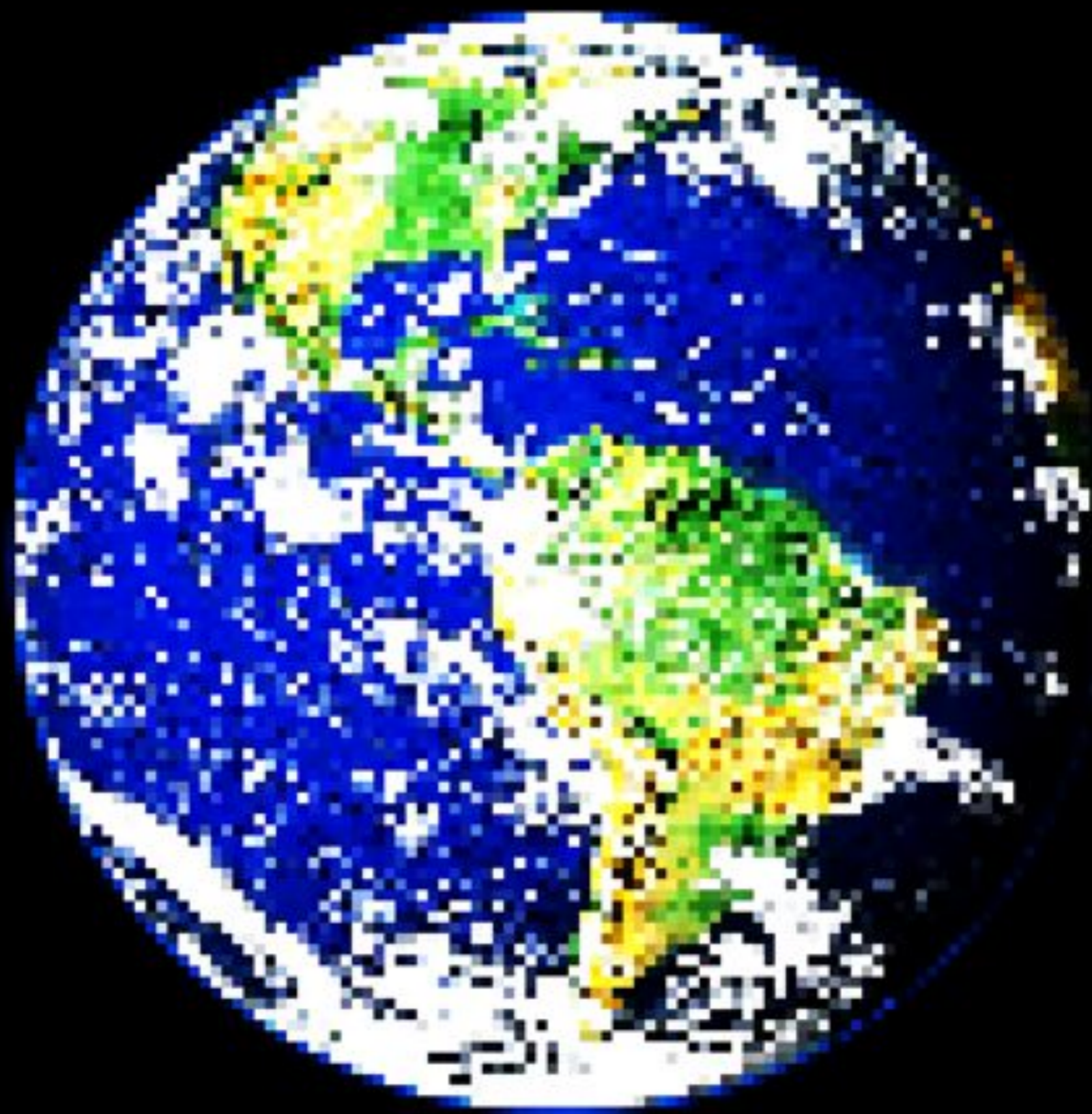

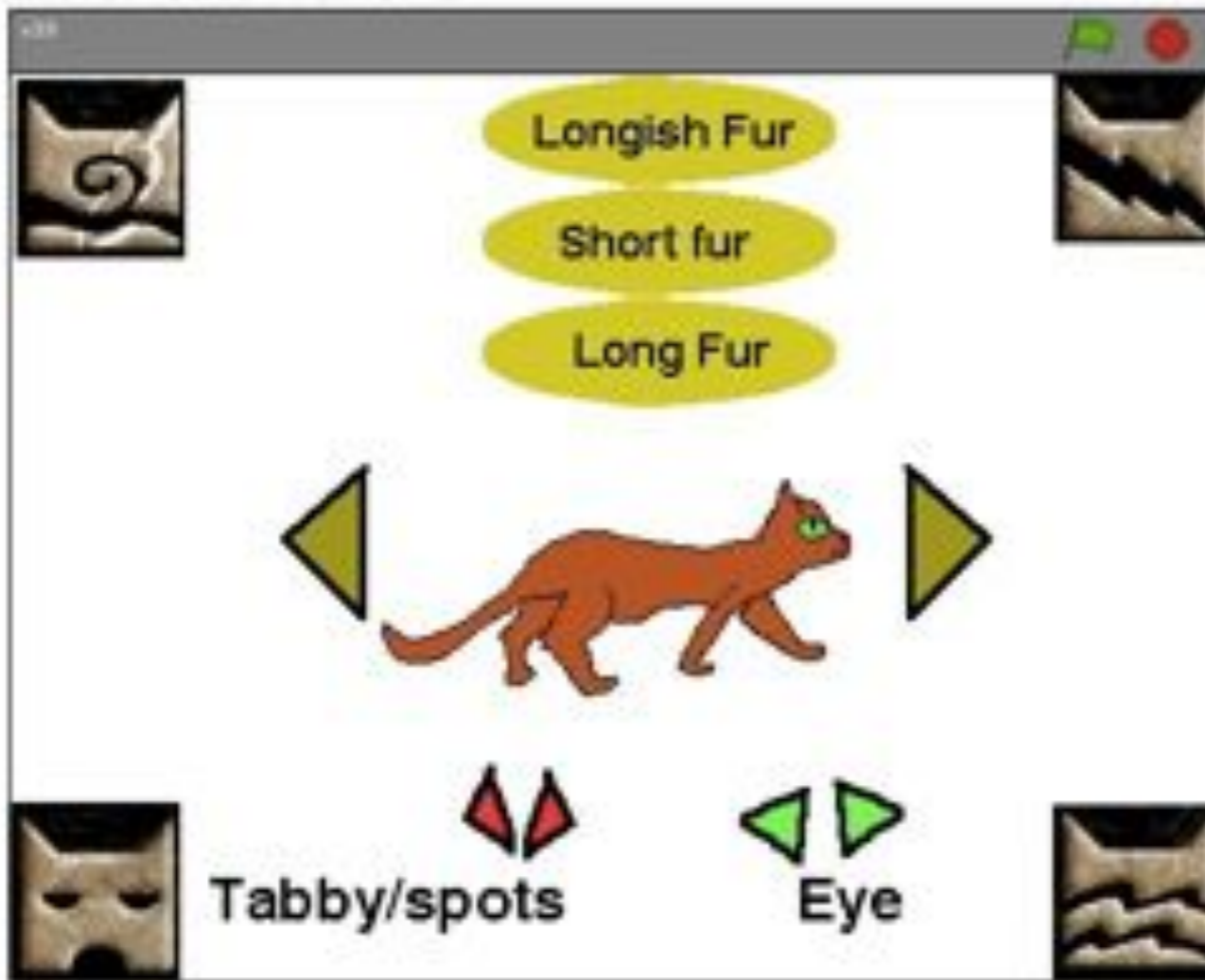
The app beat off competition from six other entrants to win the award

Facebook's \$19bn WhatsApp deal explained in 60 seconds

Facebook has bought messaging app WhatsApp in a deal worth a total of \$19bn (£11.4bn) in cash and shares.

It is the social networking giant's biggest acquisition to date.

WhatsApp has more than 450 million monthly users and is popular with people looking to avoid text messaging charges.

feature prioritarianism Result

feature prioritarianism in (biology and psychology)

feature prioritarianism shows up in a lot of ways in a wide range of philosophical and psychological contexts, though we can't hope to canvass all of these. In this section we'll run through a few of what we take to be the most prominent reasons for endorsing it.

standing

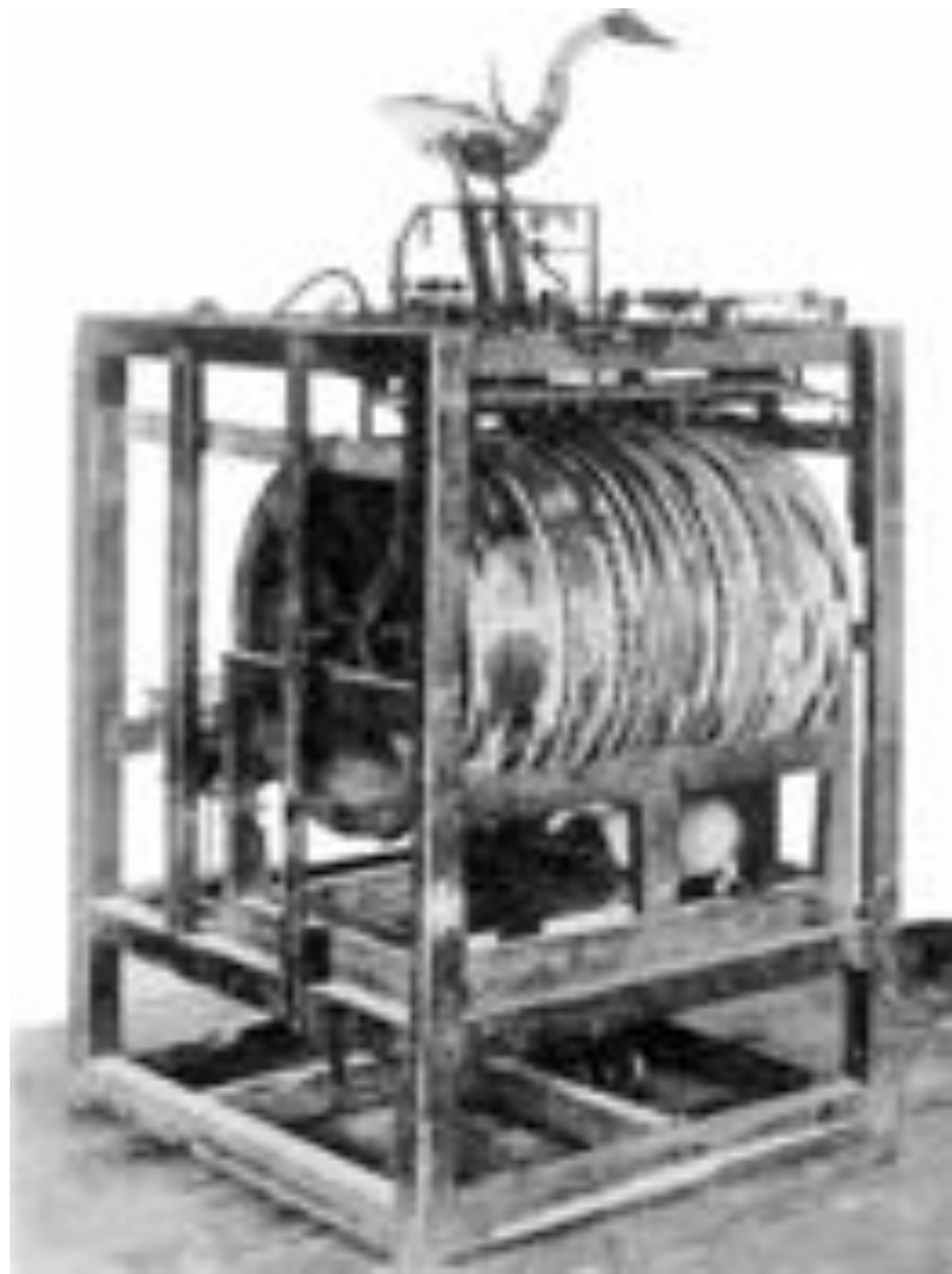
We begin with one of the most long-standing philosophical motivations for the view within analytic philosophy, which runs through a partial cluster of related concepts: the nature of ~~the~~ justification.

Components of the view we have in mind have held, first, that perception of the world is the source of ~~independent~~ justification (i.e., it states that do not require inductive support to be justified) for belief and knowledge, and, second, that the perceptual representations that can best provide justification without depending on further inductive support are those mechanically reproduced by causal contact with the world.

As it turns out, however, theorists sympathetic to this picture have tended to believe that what kinds like ours transduce mechanically from the world are (only) representations of 'basic' features — canonically, color, shape, size, and the like.

Hence, on this line of thought, feature prioritarianism falls out

the needs of an ~~epistemic~~ together with psychological facts about the scope of basic features.
